

黄文雄プロフィール

1938年、台湾高雄県岡山鎮生まれ。1964年来日。1969年、早稲田大学商学部を卒業。1971年、明治大学大学院政治経済学科西洋経済史修士。現在評論活動のほか、拓殖大学日本文化研究所客員研究員。

鋭い筆法で評論活動を続ける黄文雄は、そのダイナミックな歴史観と博覧強記の知識によって日本では文明論を展開し、台湾では哲学者としても知られている。執筆活動は日本と台湾を2本の主軸とし、言論活動はアメリカ、ヨーロッパでもなされている。

黄文雄の著述が大きな注目を集めたのは、アメリカで在米華人向けに出ている華字の新聞『台湾公論報』で2年にわたり連載されたもので、台湾で『中国之没落』とのタイトルで地下出版された。当時、きびしい言論統制がなされていた台湾では、独裁強権体制のもと、台湾の反体制運動の必読書となり、幅広い人々に読まれ、多くの台湾人に勇気を与えた。

東アジアにおける黄文雄の著作が出版されるたびに台湾、香港、中国に波及し、海賊版が出るさわぎとなっている。

台湾では、1994年、『台湾人的価値観』（前衛出版社）で、巫永福評論賞および台湾ペンクラブ賞を受賞し、漢文著書役30余冊。現在も台湾の言論界では大きな発言力を維持し続けている。日本での著作は200冊を超える。

Profile of Huang Wenxiong (Ko Bunyu)

Huang Wenxiong was born in 1938 in the Gangshan District of Kaohsiung, Taiwan. He came to Japan in 1964 and graduated from Waseda University's School of Commerce in 1969. In 1971 he received his master's degree in Western economic history from the Graduate School of Political and Economic Science at Meiji University. Currently he is an active commentator on current and historical events and is also a visiting professor at Takushoku University's Institute for Japanese Cultural Studies.

Huang is known for his trenchant writing style. In Japan his wide-ranging knowledge and penetrating views on history have sparked debate on the nature of human civilization. In his native Taiwan he is also regarded as a leading philosopher. Huang is active mainly in Japan and Taiwan, but he has also spoken in the United States and Europe.

Huang caused a huge sensation through the writings he published serially over the span of two years in the Chinese-language American newspaper the *Taiwan Tribune*, which targeted Chinese readers living in the United States. Subsequently, these writing were clandestinely published in Taiwan as a book under the title "The Downfall of China". At the time strict censorship existed in Taiwan, but Huang's book soon became required reading for Taiwanese dissidents resisting the dictatorship. Huang's writings were read widely and became a source of hope and inspiration to many Taiwanese.

Whenever Huang's works are released in East Asia, even in bootlet form, they spread to Taiwan, Hong Kong, and China, and don't fail to cause a stir.

Huang's 1994 book, "The Taiwanese Sense of Values", released in Taiwan by Qianwei Publishers, won the Wu Yongfu Critics' Prize and the Taiwan PEN Literary Award. His thirty plus Chinese language works continue to exert considerable influence on Taiwanese literary and press circles, and in Japan he is the author of over three hundred books.
